

Alphabet Memory Game

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Instructions

You will need to print two copies of the small lower case letters or the capital letters. Print on card or stick onto card so you can't read the letter from the other side!

If you don't have access to a printer, cut out paper squares and make two sets of the alphabet by writing a single letter on each square.

Now you are ready to play!

1. Start with a small number of letters, say three letters. Remember that you need two copies of each letter so you should have six letter cards in total.
2. Mix up the letters and show your child where each card is placed on the table. Now turn the cards over so they can't be seen!
3. As your child lifts one card, say the name of the letter and ask them to try to find where the matching letter is.
4. If successful, your child keeps the letters and if not, the letters are placed upside down and then it is your turn.
5. When all the letters have been won, the player with the most letters is the winner!

You can increase the number of letters at the start from three to four, etc. to make the game more difficult. You can also play this memory game using the capital letters. Have a great time with this memory and alphabet game!
