Benefits of Assistive Technology

Assistive Technology (AT) offers a powerful means of supporting those who experience challenges with literacy. These tools can help your child plan, organise, stay on task, and engage more confidently with reading and writing activities. By integrating AT into everyday learning, your child can access content in ways that suit their individual needs and learning styles. Assistive Technology tools can help promote confidence and independence.

Below is a list of some AT features that can help your child when producing work at home and in school. This list is not exhaustive and may vary depending on individual needs and available resources.

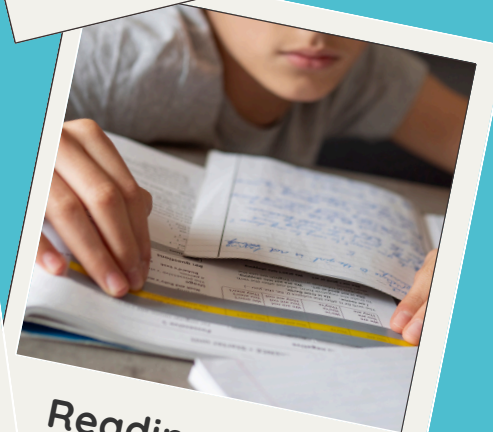

Clicker

Available across multiple platforms

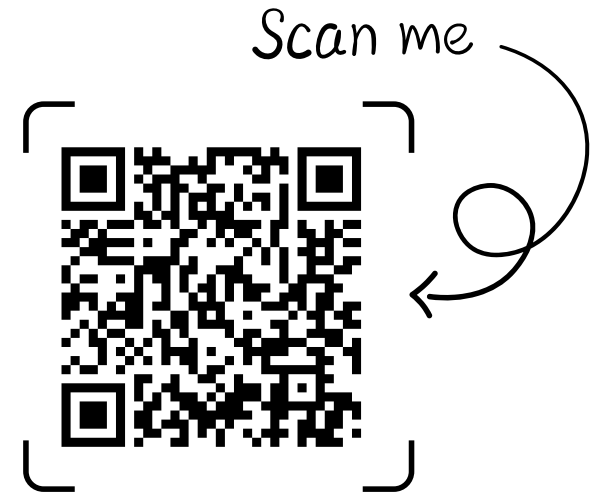
